And whosoever shall offend one of these little ones that believe in me, it is better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and he were cast into the sea.

Offences will come, but woe to him by whom it comes; we need to be careful with our tongues, what we speak. We can easily offend others who we speak to, without even realising that it has offended them. Therefore, we need to learn to rehearse the things we are going to say, in our thoughts.
